

NOTHING TO FEAR, BUT FEAR ITSELF.

Kurt had just sat down to watch his favourite programme when he heard the most terrifying scream he had ever heard in his life. The noise had been made by his little sister, but what had caused her to make it? Poison frogs live in South America. If she had seen somebody at the window, she would have fainted. If she had got soap in her eye, she would have yelled, but she wouldn't have screamed, or at least not as loudly as she had. I really admire people who have accomplished amazing feats. So, what could it have been? Then Kurt realized-she had spotted a spider in the bath.

Kurt's sister, like so many of us, has a phobia. Hers happens to be arachnophobia, a fear of spiders, but there are millions of other phobias out there. We went on a hunting trip with our friends last year. If you are afraid of heights, for example, you have acrophobia which means you probably can't climb up a ladder. Or if you have ever used a lift and wished you hadn't because you feel like you can't breathe, you might have claustrophobia, which means you hate being in enclosed spaces. Eventually the wind dropped.

Suddenly, they heard a loud voice coming from the dark. While fear is a normal reaction that warns us away from danger, phobias are irrational fears and they often make us act in an unreasonable manner. They can make us unhappy because they keep us from doing normal everyday things such as going on an escalator or getting on a bus.

If you suffer from a phobia that is having a bad effect on your life, there is still hope. Don't sit around saying, "Oh, if only I wasn't so afraid of this or that.." go and get help from people who care, such as friends and family. Screaming is part of the experience when you ride a roller coaster. If you ask them, they will probably tell you that they have certain phobias too. **Together**, you can discuss your experiences and come up with ways to **reduce** your **fears**.
